
How To Sign Up For Goodreads

Congratulations!! You're ready to open a Goodreads account.

While encouraging users to create an account for a more personalized experience, Goodreads offers certain features that can be accessed without signing up. If you choose not to create an account, you can still browse through the vast collection of books available on the platform. This includes reading book summaries, checking ratings, and perusing user reviews. Additionally, you can explore curated lists of books based on genres, themes, and user recommendations. While personalized book recommendations won't be available without an account, you can still see general recommendations provided by Goodreads. The website also allows access to a collection of quotes from various books, enabling you to explore literary gems. Moreover, you can view author profiles, their books, and other relevant information related to them. Furthermore, you may be able to access some public discussion groups where users interact and discuss books without the need to sign up. However, it's worth noting that the availability of features without an account might change over time, so it's recommended to visit the Goodreads website directly for the most current access privileges.

The Goodreads sign-up process is pretty simple. Start by visiting www.goodreads.com and clicking on the SIGN UP button. It is currently located on the right side of the home screen and only shows up if you are not a member or are not signed in. Goodreads provides you with four options for creating an account: Amazon, Apple , Facebook or email. Choose whichever one works best for you. The most popular way for creating accounts is via email, but the choice is up to you. Once you have an account, you will either be logged in automatically when you visit Goodreeads or you will click on the Sign In link.

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Each of the sign-in methods is similar, so I'll walk you through the steps for signing in

with your email address. You will need to provide the following information:

- 1. Provide your name (It asks for your first and last name, but you can use either or both.)
- 2. Provide your email address.
- 3. Choose a password. (It must be at least 6 characters.)
- 4. re-enter your password.
- 5. Click on the "Create account" button.
- 6. You will automatically be taken to a "Verify email address" page. Goodreads will send a One Time Password (OTP) to your email address. Once you enter that OTP in the "Enter OTP" box, you have a Goodreads account. Don't forget your username (email) and password.
- You will then be taken to a "Get book recommendations..." page. (You can skip this page for now.)
- Next you'll be asked to set a reading goal. It just takes a couple seconds, or you can skip it.

- 9. Select your favorite reading genres. (Must choose at least one)
- 10. Rate (as few or) as many books as you'd like, then click on "I'm finished rating" near the top right side of the page.
- 11. On the next page, click "Done here? See what's next".

You are officially signed up for Goodreads. Now your account screen will look

How to Set Up your Profile

Setting up a user profile on Goodreads is a straightforward process. Here's a step-by-step guide to help you create your account:

1. In the upper right corner of your Goodreads home page, you'll see a circle with a very light colored image of a person reading a book. Click on this circle.

- 2. The very top choice in the pull-down menu is your user name. Right under that, you'll see the word "Profile." Click on that, and you'll arrive at your profile page.
- You'll see editable boxes labeled First Name, Middle Name and Last Name. If you're satisfied with what is already in there, leave it as is. Otherwise, you can change these at any time.
- 4. Decide the display order of your name and who will be able to view your last name (if you have provided it).
- Provide a zip code and Country where you live. Then choose who can view your location. (Everyone, friends only or no one)
- 6. It is optional whether you provide a birth date.
- 7. Next, you can add the URL of your website, if you have one. You can use this to provide your Twitter, Facebook, Instagram or other social media site, if you don't have a website.
- 8. More optional information you can add now (or later) includes your interests, what kind of books you like to read and other details about you.

Congratulations! Your profile is now set up. You can start exploring the Goodreads website, add more books to your shelves, write reviews, join book clubs, and connect with other readers who share your literary interests. Remember to keep your profile information up-to-date and engage with the Goodreads community to get the most out of your reading experience on the platform.

Chapter Three


Navigating Goodreads

If you prefer to learn by browsing the website on your own, you can either skim this chapter or use it as an outline for your own exploration.

Menu Bar(s)



At the top of nearly every Goodreads website page, you will find two important menu bars. The first one is on top and includes a search bar and five circular logos. For this top menu bar, I'll guide you from right to left.



Reader Circle

This is the circle on the far right of the Goodreads page and is probably the **most important item in the menu bar.** It is the only circular logo (in this menu bar) that is a pulldown menu once it is clicked. Let's call this the "Personalized Menu Circle." When all else fails, check out this important menu option to look for answers and solutions. As with all of the menu bar selections, feel free to explore and experiment with the options. You will soon grow comfortable navigating Goodreads. The Personalized Menu Circle includes the following options/tools:

- A link to your **Profile** page
- Your Friends list

- Groups you've joined
- Access to your Goodreads Discussions
- The **Comments** from your recent posts
- Your **Reading Challenge**, if you have chosen to partake
- **Kindle Notes & Highlights**, where you can review notes and highlights you've made in Kindle books you may have purchased on Amazon
- The **Quotes** you've liked
- A list of your Favorite genres
- Friends' recommendations (view or request)
- Access to your Account settings
- Help pages
- The option to Sign out of your account access

Of the thirteen pull-down menu options listed above, the two most important are likely to be the Profile link and the Account Settings link. To the left of the Reader Circle is the:

Friends Circle

The Friends circle in the Goodreads top menu bar is a valuable feature that enables users to connect and interact with their friends and fellow book lovers. Once you have set up your Goodreads account and added friends, the Friends circle becomes accessible.

When you first start using your new Goodreads account, you will see a message that says, "You have no friends yet!" *Don't take it personally.* (-: Clicking on this circle takes you to the Friends page, where you can view updates from your friends, including their recent book reviews, ratings, and reading progress. This page provides a personalized feed of activities, keeping you updated on your friends' literary adventures and allowing you to discover new books and authors based on their recommendations. Moreover, you can send messages to your friends directly from this page to discuss books, share thoughts, or plan reading challenges together. Additionally, the Friends circle offers an opportunity to join or create reading groups, where you can engage in meaningful discussions, participate in book clubs, and explore diverse perspectives on different literary works.

Home

The "Home" page on Goodreads serves as a personalized hub for users to discover, engage, and keep up-to-date with their reading community. Here is a detailed explanation of what you can find on the "Home" page of Goodreads:

Then click on the black box that says, 'Done.' Now you have your own bookshelves ready for adding more of your favorite reads. **Tip:** You can also create gift shelves (birthday, holidays, friends, etc.) when you find books that you may want to give as presents. Bookshelves will be described in greater detail in the next chapter.

Recommending Books to Goodreads Friends

To recommend books to your friends (or students) on Goodreads, you can follow these steps:

1. Log in to your Goodreads account. If you don't have an account, you can create one for free on the Goodreads website.

2. Once you're logged in, navigate to the book's page that you want to recommend. You can search for the book using the search bar at the top of the page.

3. On the book's page, scroll down until you find the section titled "Recommend It." Here, you'll see a button labeled "Recommend." Click on this button.

4. A pop-up window will appear with the heading "Recommend to Friends." In this window, you can select the friends you want to recommend the book to. You can either choose individual friends by checking the box next to their names or select all friends by checking the "Select All" box.

5. Once you've selected the friends you want to recommend the book to, you can add a personal message to accompany the recommendation. This step is optional but can help provide context or share your thoughts about the book.
